Bond Measure Update - District Action

Thank you to the Dayville School District citizens who supported the School District Bond Measure on May 21, 2019. The District obtained final results from Grant County Clerk Brenda Percy on June 12, 2019:

81 YES 45 NO

Thus, at a Special Meeting on June 18, 2019, the DSD Board of Directors were able to affirm the results and adopt Resolution 03-2019 that authorizes the District to attempt to sell one or more bonds not to exceed \$700,000. The District is represented by James Shannon, of Mersereau and Shannon, Bond Counsel and Nancy Hungerford of Hungerford Law, General Counsel.

The Board authorized Superintendent to contract with Carol Samuels of Piper Jaffray to conduct the sale of the bonds.

The Board approved hiring Scott Marshall, of Straightline Architects, to launch the architect/engineering process for the repairs and upgrades. Mr. Marshall is the architect who complete the Facility Needs Assessment for the District in August, 2018.

OSCIM Matching Grant: Dayville School District qualified for a matching grant from the School Facilities Office of Oregon Department of Education for \$700,000. This grant cannot be accessed until the Bond is sold. Business

Manager Jody Winkelman has completed as much paperwork as we can complete to this date.

SEISMIC FACILITY ASSESSMENT GRANT: In related news, the District obtained a \$25,000 grant from the School Facilities Office to conduct a study of seismic considerations – potential upgrades. The District hired Walker Structural Engineering of Bend, Oregon to complete this study. The engineers will be here the week of July 8, 2019. This study, if the Board so directs, could put us in line for seismic repair grants from Business Oregon.
